Congratulations to the 2022 MGABC Golden Trowel award winner from the Victoria Chapter, Master Gardener Linda Cross.

Linda began training in 2004 and became a fully fledged Master Gardener with the Victoria Chapter in 2005.

As well as clinics, plant sales and the usual volunteer activities, she has always been a leader in educating, not only the general public, but also other Master Gardeners. She has been a Mentor in her own Chapter, a committee member for the coordination and evaluation of each Basic Training class and participated as a Committee member at the Provincial Level helping establish criteria for all Basic Training Courses in BC.

Linda was instrumental in establishing the first Master Class, "Vegetable Galore" with Linda Gilkeson, it is now an annual event. She co-chaired for the Advanced

Training Program, and in fact, is one of its first graduates. She was the creator and lead of the virtual Master Gardener Basic Training Program in 2020, as a strategy for continuing education during the pandemic, we have all benefited from this use of Zoom.

Linda is a true educator and someone whose love and knowledge of gardening has benefitted countless other gardeners and with her keen interest in Native species, she fits right in with today's theme: *Bringing the Wild into your Garden*.

My few words of introduction and congratulations pale in comparison to the letters of support we received for Linda's nomination. Please join me in congratulating our 2022 MGABC Golden Trowel winner: **Linda Cross.**
